VARIETIES IN THIS GARDEN

- Achillea Little Moonshine—Featured Rozanne[®] and Friends variety**
A compact sport of the popular 'Moonshine' Yarrow, with similar bright gold flowers but with a compact habit. Begins blooming in late spring and continues through early fall.
Height and spread: 10-12" (25-30cm); 14-16" (35-40cm)
Flowering time: Late spring through early fall
US hardiness zone: 4-9
Aftercare Info: Cutback after initial flush of flowers for reblooming
Recommended number of plants: A triangle grouping of 3 plants, spaced 12" (30 cm) apart, on either side of the Red-Hot Poker plants.
- Euphorbia polychroma 'Bonfire'—Featured Rozanne[®] and Friends variety**
Green buds open to rich maroon-red leaves. Glowing chartreuse-gold flowers contrast strikingly in spring.
Exposure: Sun
Height and Spread: 10" (25 cm); 18" (46 cm)
Flowering time: Spring
US Hardiness Zones: 5-9. Hardy to -17C/1F
Aftercare info: Easily grows in average soils. After enjoying flowers, cutback stems to 6" (15 cm) above ground. Plants will re-grow into nice, smoldering-red foliage mounds. Do not cut back plants for winter—foliage will help protect crowns from excessive moisture. Trim foliage in spring to encourage a new growth.
Recommended number of plants: 3 plants, placed 12" (30 cm) apart, about 12" (30cm) in front of Red-Hot Poker plants.
- Kniphofia 'Papaya Popsicle' USPP# 22915**
Rather short and compact compared to other Red-Hot Pokers, with large, showy flowers. Attract all sorts of pollinators to the garden—especially hummingbirds.
Exposure: Sun
Height and Spread: 12" (30cm) foliage height (20" (51cm) in flower); 18" (46 cm)
Flowering time: Easrly summer, summer, early fall, fall
US Hardiness Zones: 6-9.
Aftercare info: Performs best in well-drained soils, especially over winter. Maybe evergreen in milder climate zones. Do not cut back plants for winter—foliage will help protect crowns from excessive moisture. Trim foliage in spring to encourage a new growth.
Recommended number of plants: 3 plants placed 16" (41 cm) apart in the center of design.
- Diervilla rivularis Kodiak[®] Black—Accent Shrub**
This native Bush Honeysuckle is used to line the home's foundation to provide a season-long backdrop of dramatic deep-burgundy foliage. These tough natives can withstand the reflected heat from a south-facing wall, once established. Tolerates a wide range of soils, from wet to dry. Cut back in spring before new growth appears. Use a back row of 3 plants; 36" (46 cm) apart, and 36" (46 cm) away from foundation wall.
