We have enlisted the help of regional Garden Design Experts to select other “must-have”, perennial varieties for your locale to complement the featured **Rozanne and Friends** varieties. These varieties will likely be standard offerings at your favorite retailer, or you can ask for similar substitutes. Such variety names are not emphasized in bold.

To further enhance these Garden Designs, accent trees, shrubs, garden art or structures may be shown. If such accents are not available at your favorite retailer, ask them for a suitable alternative.

Seasons of Interest: Late spring through fall

Please note that not all plants may bloom at the same time as depicted on this design. See variety description for individual variety bloom seasons.

VARIETIES IN THIS GARDEN

- Geranium Rozanne®**—Featured **Rozanne®** and **Friends** variety
 Rozanne's violet blue blooms with white centers flower profusely from late spring through to late fall. Flowers are formed over mounded, slightly marbled, deep green foliage which turns reddish brown in the autumn for added interest.
Height and spread: 18-20" (45-50 cm); 24-28" (60-70 cm)
Flowering time: Late spring through late fall
US hardiness zone: Z5-8; Hardy down to 5°F (-15°C)
Aftercare Info: Requires little maintenance other than watering in dry periods and occasional feeding with an all-purpose flower food. Remove dead heads to prolong flowering period.
Recommended number of plants: 2-3—use 1 plant every 18-20" (46-51 cm) in front of the Peony.
- Echinacea 'Cheyenne Spirit'**
 Starts pumping out golden yellow, orange, magenta and tomato-red flowers in mid-summer and easily continues until early fall.
Height and spread: 18-30" (46-76 cm); 10-20" (25-50 cm)
Flowering time: Summer to fall
US hardiness zone: 4-10
Aftercare Info: Great cut flower for mixed bouquets. Drought tolerant.
Recommended number of plants: 3-5, use 1 plant per every 12" (30 cm) or border in front of the Hydrangea accent shrub.
- Paeonia 'Bartzella'** Intersectional peony
 Produces huge, semi-double fragrant blooms in spring held by stiff stems that rarely need staking.
Height and Spread: 36" (91cm); 36" (91cm)
Flowering time: Spring
US Hardiness Zones: 4-9
Aftercare info: Remove spent flowers but do not cut back plants until fall. Nice, fragrant cut flower.
Recommended number of plants: 1, behind the border of Rozanne, next to birdbath. Plant 36" (91cm) back from edge of border.
- Panicum virgatum 'Heavy Metal'** switch grass
 Features steely-blue leaf color for a striking summer backdrop. Turns shimmering golden yellow in fall before making an elegant statement in the winter landscape
Height and Spread: 48"-72" (122-183cm); 36" (91cm)
Flowering time: Midsummer through late fall, with winter interest if not cut back.
US Hardiness Zones: 5-9
Aftercare info: Cut back plants to 6" (15cm) in late winter, early spring, before new growth appears.
Recommended number of plants: 1, planted at back of bed, 36" (91cm) away from other plants.
- Hydrangea paniculata 'Little Quick Fire'**—Accent Plant
 Shown in this design as a pink-flowered shrub, use 1 plant behind the 'Cheyenne Spirit' centered between the bird bath and stone wall. The hydrangea flowers begin in early summer as white, then rosy-pink and finally pink-tinted tan in fall—a perfect foil to Rozanne's violet flowers.
